The Fast CAT trial will be held at the Back 40 / Polo Field located within Myers Park. Upon entering the park through the main entrance, follow the Fast CAT or Back 40 / Polo Field event signs to the trial site and designated parking area. The park offers ample on-site parking adjacent to the field.→†

From Dallas/Fort Worth

Take US-75 North toward McKinney.

Exit FM 1461 (Laud Howell Parkway).

Turn left (west) onto FM 1461.

Turn right onto County Road 166.

Continue approximately 1 mile to the entrance of Myers Park & Event Center.

After entering the park, follow the event signs to the Back 40 / Polo Field.

From Sherman

Take US-75 South to the FM 1461 exit.

Turn right (west) onto FM 1461.

Turn right onto County Road 166.

Enter Myers Park & Event Center and follow the posted event signs to the Back 40 / Polo Field.

TESTS, TITLES & TIMING

How Does a Fast CAT Work?

1. Fast CAT is a 100 yard timed straight course.
(Our course is Totally fenced)
2. Dogs run one at a time.
3. The dog's completing the 100 yd dash are time and then the time is converted into mph. Divide 204.545 into the dogs time

Example : $204.505 / 10 \text{ second} = 20.454$

4. A handicap system is applied to a dog's MPH to determine the number of points earned. The handicap system is based on the height of the dog at its withers: a. 18" or greater = handicap is 1.0, b. 12" up to less than 18" = handicap is 1.5, c. Below 12" = handicap is 2.0

5. Points = MPH multiplied by the dog's handicap

6. Fast CAT suffix titles are earned at designated milestones:

- a. BCAT = 150 points
- b. DCAT = 500 points
- c. FCAT = 1,000 points
- d. FCAT# = every additional 500 points

7. Timing Devices: The time to complete the 100-yard dash is recorded to the nearest 1/100th of a second (e.g. 9.11). The club may use stopwatches or break-the-beam equipment to obtain the time. If stopwatches are used, there shall be two timers positioned at the finish line. An individual at the start line shall signal with an arm drop the moment the nose of the dog crosses the start line. The timers shall start their stopwatches at the bottom of the arm drop. The timers shall stop their watches when the nose of the dog crosses the finish line. The times from the two stopwatches shall be averaged to determine the recorded time.

8. Area of the course will be fenced with a fenced-in recovery area of 30 yards or larger.

ALL DOGS RUN AT OWNERS SOLE RISK

NOTICE TO ALL EXHIBITORS

1. Coursing Ability & Fast Cat tests are open to all dogs 12 months of age or older that are individually registered with AKC, recognized foreign registries, possess an FSS number, pal # ILP # or Canine Partner Program number, open to all sighthounds as well as those with breed disqualifications.
2. Mixed breeds must be spayed or neutered to be eligible to run. AKC registered dogs with breed disqualifications may be entered.
3. Not AKC registered? – NO PROBLEM! You will can register your Canine Partner with AKC. you download the registration form at: <http://www.akc.org/dog-owners/canine-partners/enroll/>
4. Entries will not be accepted without fees, signatures or the “Agreement” found on the Official AKC Entry Form.
5. Bitches in season and lame dogs will be refused entry at inspection.
A refund for bitches in season will be given with a Note from a Vet office.
6. Coursing is an athletic activity that can tax a dog’s physical strength. Dogs that are overweight and/or out of condition may be at greater risk for injury and exhaustion. The Inspection Committee has the authority to disallow a dog’s entry into a test, and in such instances applicable entry fees will be refunded.
7. Battery powered, continuous loop lure machines will be used. The lure will consist of white plastic strips. Backup equipment will be available.
8. Muzzles are allowed. No pinch collars, and no electronic training collars or devices are allowed.” The club recommends using a plain buckle collar and lead. No flexi leads will be allowed for safety reasons.
9. Exhibitors should follow their veterinarian’s recommendation to assure their dogs are free of parasites, any communicable diseases and have appropriate vaccinations.
10. The Huntmaster is responsible for field safety and therefore he/she is in complete charge of all dogs and handlers on the field. In service to this responsibility, he/she has the authority to stop the lure in any potentially dangerous situation and signal the handler to retrieve a testing dog.
11. Any decisions made by the event’s officiating judge(s) regarding the performance of an entered dog shall be final. Full discretionary power is given to the judge(s) to withhold any and all qualifications for lack of merit. The Judge(s) is responsible for ensuring compliance with the AKC Regulations on the field.

12. No entry fees will be refunded if the event cannot be started or completed by reason of riots, civil disturbances, fire, extreme and/or dangerous weather conditions, an act of God, public emergency, act of a public enemy, strikes or any other cause beyond the control of the Club or its members and representatives.
 13. Persons exhibiting conduct detrimental to ALCR and any dog(s)/other person(s) will be asked to leave the trial site.
 14. There will be a minimum \$25 returned check charge.
 15. A \$5.00 fine will be assessed for any loose dog on the field that is not competing in the trial in progress.
 16. A \$5.00 fine will be assessed for any handler not cleaning up after their dog.
 17. ALCR reserve the right to alter the course due to field and or weather conditions on the day of the trial.
 18. Children Must be accompanied by an adult and under supervision at all times.
 19. Only the Lure Operator, Huntmaster, Judge, and Handler of the dog running the trial will be permitted near the lure machine.
 20. The event-hosting , American Lure Course Racing and its agents, members, representatives, and volunteers assume no liability or responsibility for any loss, damage or injury sustained by exhibitors, handlers, or to any of their dogs or property and further assumes no responsibility for injury to children or spectators before, during, or after this event.
- ****NEW AKC RULE**** - Any dog that eliminates on course will receive a non-qualifying (NQ) score.

Recognizing that periodically reaffirming our shared values strengthens our community, the revised code will be shared widely to highlight the foundational values and principles that define the sport.

- Sportspeople always place the welfare of their dog above all else.
- Sportspeople prioritize the long-term health and preservation of their breed, making decisions that reflect a deep commitment to responsible breeding and ownership.
- Sportspeople respect the history, traditions and integrity of the sport of purebred dogs.
- Sportspeople conduct themselves in a manner that reflects positively on the sport, the American Kennel Club, and themselves.
- Sportspeople appreciate, encourage and support all who associate with and participate in the sports by fostering an environment where respect, equity, inclusion, and courtesy are foundational.
- Sportspeople understand, uphold and abide by all AKC bylaws, rules, regulations and policies.
- Sportspeople contribute to a positive atmosphere at events by avoiding negative gossip, disparagement, or unsportsmanlike behavior.
- Sportspeople extend their values of civility, fairness, and respect to all digital and social media platforms.
- Sportspeople actively support the education and mentorship of newcomers, helping them learn the rules, values, and traditions of the sport in a respectful way.
- Sportspeople recognize that they are role models in the sport, and strive to lead by example through humility, kindness, and ethical conduct.
- Sportspeople treat fellow exhibitors, judges, officials, volunteers, spectators, and AKC staff with dignity and respect, regardless of experience, background, or differences in opinion.
- Sportspeople are committed to fair play, honesty, courtesy, and competition, approaching both winning and losing with grace.
- Sportspeople understand that strong competition and civility can—and should—coexist. They appreciate the quality of their competitors, and the effort put forth by others.
- Sportspeople uphold their responsibilities to the sport of purebred dogs and refuse to let personal gain or self-interest influence their decisions or behavior.
- The sportsperson judges only on the merits of the dogs and considers no other factors.
- The sportsperson judge or exhibitor accepts constructive criticism.
- The sportsperson exhibitor declines to enter or exhibit under a judge where it might reasonably appear that the judge's placements could be based on something other than the merits of the dogs.
- The sportsperson exhibitor refuses to compromise the impartiality of a judge.
- Sportspeople are willing to share honest and open appraisals of both the strengths and weaknesses of their breeding stock.
- Sportspeople decline to exploit any positions of authority or recognition for personal advantage.
- Sportspeople appreciate those that have gone before them and realize they are responsible for maintaining and enhancing the sport for future generations.

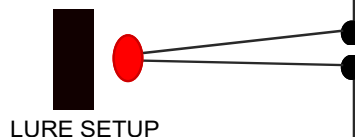

ends.

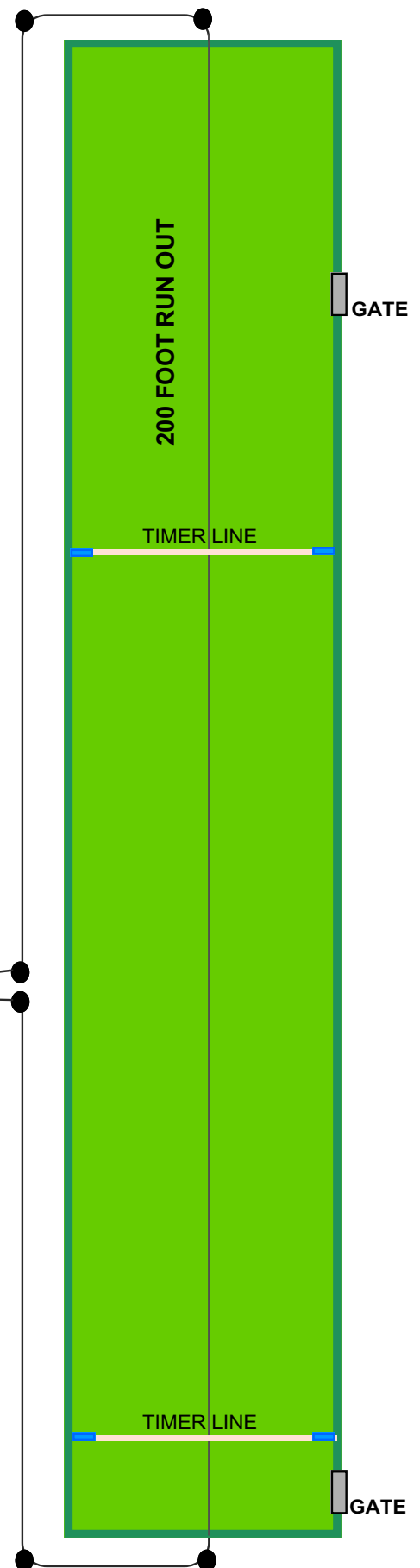
